BUSHCARE GROUPS IN THE MUNDARING AREA

Below are details of just some of the many volunteer bushcare groups in the Perth Hills area in and around the Shire of Mundaring (SoM), in Western Australia.

The contacts and even the titles of the registered Friends groups are hard to find, because of privacy concerns. So, here is some info I've collected from various sources including public sources. Most of it has been proof-read and approved by the groups listed.

As at 2024 there were said to be about eighty unincorporated volunteer bushcare Friends groups registered with SoM, but many were inactive.

There is also a big group in John Forrest National Park which is registered with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA). They're focused on weed control using many methods, and having morning tea.

The many SoM Friends groups in bush reserves are involved in weed control but they also plant seedlings/tubestock, control erosion, or install habitat boxes etc. And they have morning tea!

For more details, eg phone numbers or other groups, contact the Shire's Community Landcare Officer, Daniel Pekel, so he can put you in touch.

Daniel wrote in November 2025:

Could you have a look at the new online map and let me know which group you're wanting to contact? I can't pass personal details on without consent so I need to know which one.
